## THE 2011 MITCHELL LECTURE

The 2011 Mitchell Lecture revisits a major address at UB's Centennial by U.S. Supreme Court Justice Robert H. Jackson, delivered immediately after Justice Jackson returned from serving as the Chief U.S. prosecutor at the Nuremberg Trial in 1946. Three distinguished legal scholars will place the extraordinary speech in historical context and discuss its enduring implications.

Center in Jamestown, N.Y., will discuss "Bringing Nuremberg Home: Justice Jackson's Path Back to Buffalo, October 4, 1946." Professor Barrett is writing a biography of Justice Jackson.



• Eric L. Muller, professor at the University of North Carolina School of Law and a legal historian with special

interest in the Japanese internment cases during World War II, will discuss "Nazis, Americans, and the Law as a 'Peace Profession.'"

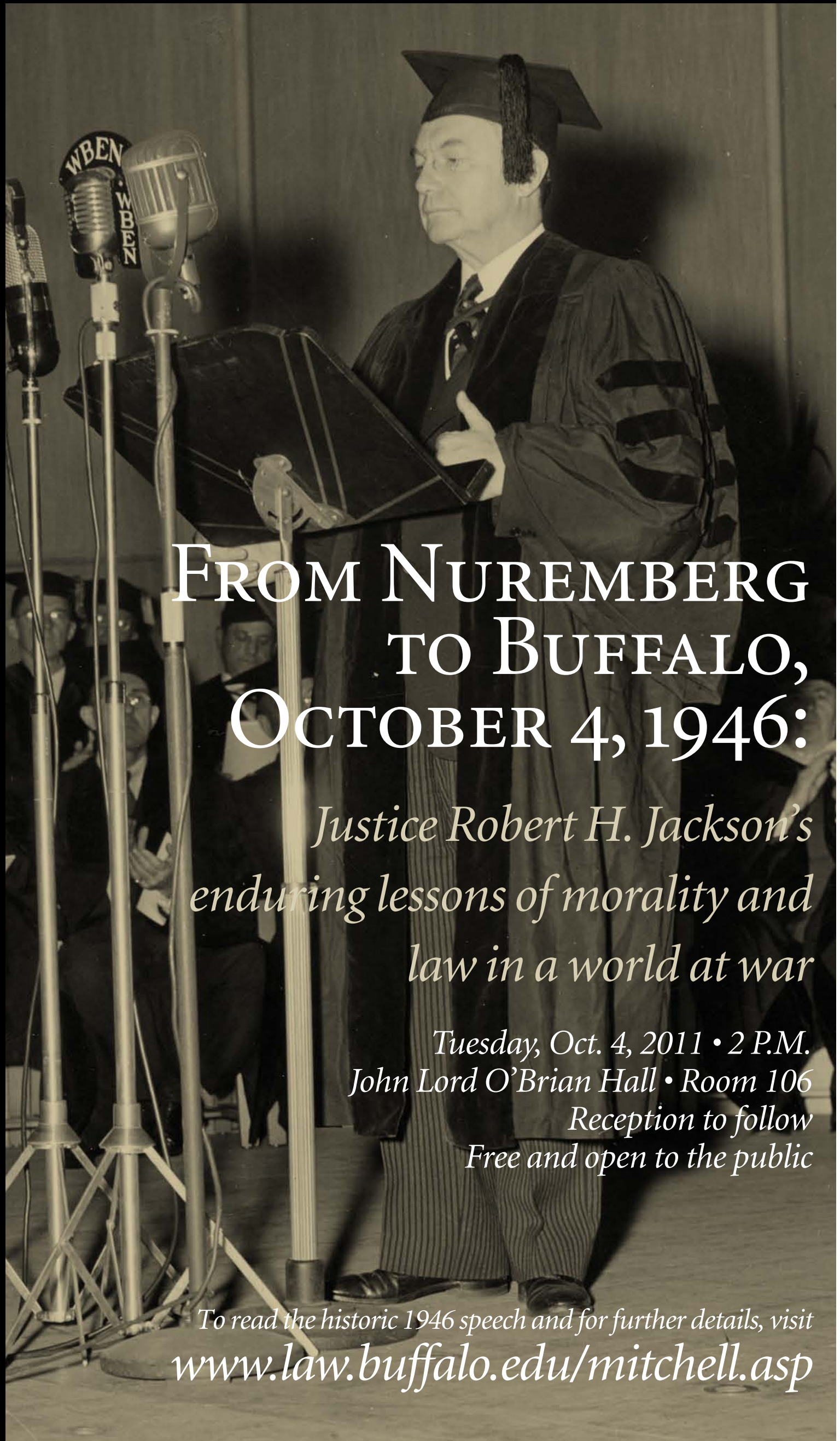


• Mary L. Dudziak, the Judge Edward J. and Ruey L. Guirado Professor of Law, History and Political Science at the
